

## PUBLIC NOTICE

### **Subject: Compliance of the provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 by the existing Teacher Education Institutions offering M.Ed., B.Ed. and B.P.Ed. courses**

In order to implement the NCTE Regulations, 2014, all the existing TEIs running B.Ed. course were allowed either to have 2 or more units or to have one unit only from the Academic Session 2015-16. The TEIs which opted for two or more units of B.Ed. were required to appoint additional faculty & staff by 29.02.2016 and to provide the additional infrastructure as required under NCTE Regulations, 2014 prior to 31.10.2015 which was later on extended up to 30.05.2016.

In case of B.P.Ed., the intake has been increased to 100 students (one unit) from the existing 50 and in case of M.Ed. to 50 (one unit) from the existing 35 students subject to appointment of additional faculty & staff by 29.02.2016 and to provide the additional infrastructure as required under NCTE Regulations, 2014 prior to 31.10.2015 which was later on extended up to 30.05.2016.


A Public Notice dated 18.12.2015 has already been issued by the NRC, NCTE, Jaipur in this regard.

NCTE (HQ), New Delhi *vide* its letter No. 48-11/2016/N&S/28811 dated 17.05.2016 has directed the NRC to initiate the process of monitoring the existing TEIs in compliance of the provisions of NCTE Regulations, 2014. The Northern Regional Committee considered the matter in detail and decided that the TEIs running M.Ed., B.Ed. (having two or more units) and B.P.Ed. courses under the jurisdiction of NRC be directed through this Public Notice to submit the following documents to NRC office on or before 13.06.2016 positively:-

- List of the faculty and staff as required under the NCTE Regulations, 2014 duly approved by the Affiliating Body.
- Building Completion Certificate in the prescribed format duly certified by the Competent Govt. Authority.
- Building Plan containing all the details with regard to the name of the institution, course being run, Plot No. / Khasra No., total area of the land, total built-up area, measurements of Multipurpose Hall, labs, classrooms etc. approved by the competent govt. Authority.
- Copies of Fixed Deposit Receipts of Endowment Fund & Reserve Fund of Rs. 7.00 Lacs & Rs. 5.00 Lacs respectively in the joint account of RD, NRC, NCTE and the authorized representative of the applicant Society/Trust/Company along with the form "A" verified by the Manager of the concerned Bank.

The documents received from TEIs will be considered by the NRC, NCTE and if it is found that the institution has not submitted the above mentioned documents in compliance of the Regulations, 2014 within stipulated time, an appropriate action under Section 17 of the NCTE Act, 1993 for withdrawal of recognition shall be initiated prior to the commencement of the Academic Session 2016-17.


The office of the NRC has issued revised recognition orders to the teacher education institutions which have been granted recognition for B.Ed., M.Ed. and B.P.Ed. programmes as the duration of these programme have been extended from one year to two years in the NCTE Regulations, 2014. The revised recognition orders so issued make a mention that the institutions will be required to comply with the conditions mentioned therein by 31.10.2015.

A large number of institutions have represented in NRC, Hqrs. and at also at different forums. The NCTE Hqrs. after due consideration brought this fact to the notice of NCTE Council in its meeting held on 26.11.2015. The Council after due deliberation decided that NCTE may extend deadline beyond 31<sup>st</sup> October keeping in view the practical difficulty of institutions as the admission of the students of second year will be made after 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2016. Therefore, the NCTE Hqrs. has decided to extend the deadline beyond 31<sup>st</sup> October in the following manner :-

For submission of approved faculty from the affiliating bodies after completing formalities of identification, selection and approval etc.	29 <sup>th</sup> February, 2016
With regard to additional built up area and additional FDRs in joint account.	30 <sup>th</sup> May, 2016

In view of the above, institutions running above courses / programmes are hereby directed to complete all formalities before the last date as shown in the above table and submit the compliance without any further delay.

No further extension will be given and non-compliance or non-submission of replies will be treated as violation of NCTE Act.

**Subject: Implementation of NCTE Regulation 2014 in respect of two year Courses of B.Ed., M.Ed. etc.**

Sir,

As you are aware, consequent upon reduction in the intake capacity of the two year Courses of B.Ed./B.P.Ed. in NCTE Regulation 2014 to 50 students from 100 students earlier, the TEI's were allowed to either continue to admit 100 students ( two Units) during the first year of admission or else reduce it to 50 students (one units). The TEIs which opted for one unit of 50 students in B.ED. /B.P.Ed. programmes were not required to appoint any additional faculty & Staff or provide for any additional infrastructure, under NCTE Regulation 2014, during second year of the programme. However, in case of TEIs, which opted for two units of 50 students each, full complement of Faculty/staff was required to be appointed for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the B.Ed. / B.P.Ed. Course by a date specified by the Council. These TEIs were also required to increase the built up area by 500 Sqm, for an additional intake of one hundred students. Similarly, in case of M.Ed. course additional Faculty/Staff was required to be provided, during the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the programme. Moreover, FDRs in the joint account, for the increased amount of Reserve Fund were also required to be submitted by these institutions.

2. NCTE, vide its letter dated 24<sup>th</sup> December 2014 issued Guidelines for processing of pending application under Regulation 2014. The Guideline were issued as per decision taken by the NCTE Council vide 41<sup>st</sup> meeting held on 27.11.2014, which were subsequently modified as per decision taken in the 45<sup>th</sup> meeting of the council, held on 26<sup>th</sup> November 2015. In accordance with these guidelines the institutions which were given permission to offer two basic units of B.Ed. /B.P.Ed. Course, were required to inform Regional Committee, with

necessary documents about additional built-up area, additional infrastructure, additional staff FDR's in Joint Account for the difference in Endowment Reserve Found etc. The Regional Committee were required to arrange for inspection of the premises of these institutions for verification of documents and verify adherence to these conditions by a specified date. In case of the institutions which fail to comply with these requirements, the intake capacity of two basic unit was to be reduced to one basic unit.

3. In view of above, the Regional Directors of NCTE are requested to initiate the process of monitoring the compliance of the above provisions in the Regulation by the concerned institutions if not already done. The defaulting TEI's need to be asked to submit the necessary documents along with the documents related to additional Faculty/Staff through the concerned affiliating university, to the Regional Committee and on the basis of these documents, the intake capacity of the TEI's may be determined afresh. If felt necessary, an inspection of the institutions may also be conducted for this purpose. The intake capacity of each institution, where it is reduced by the Regional Committee to one basic unit, shall need to be intimated to the concerned affiliating university, well before the commencement of the academic session 2016-17. An intimation about action taken in this regard may be intimated to this office.

This issues with the approval of the competent authority.
